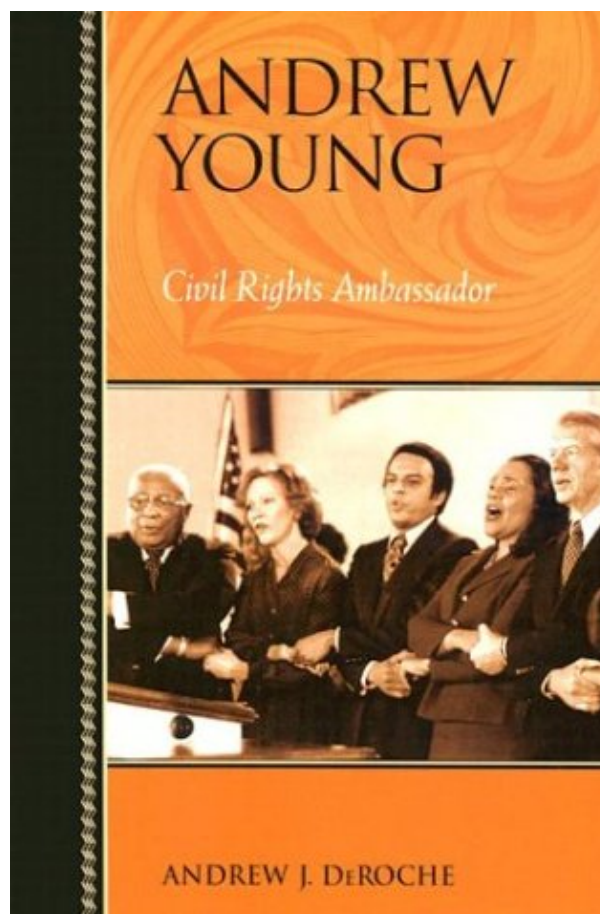
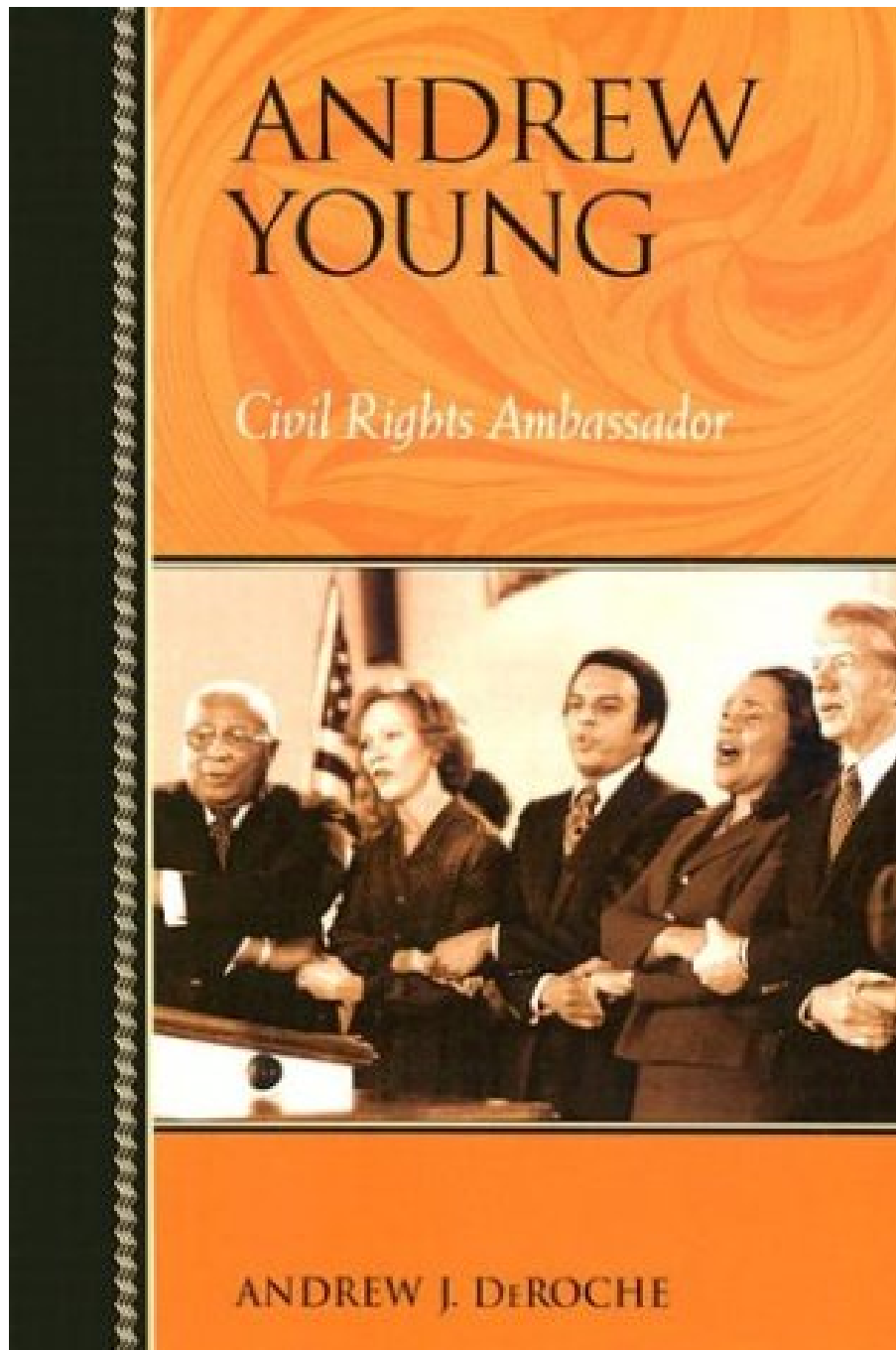

In particular, there is very little written about any domestic/municipal policy work that Young did while he was the mayor of Atlanta (1981-1989), other than his work on the bid for the 1996 Olympics.
